Master of Ceremonies

Emilio Peluso Neder Meyer is a Tenured Full-Time Associate Professor of Constitutional Law at the Faculty of Law, Federal University of Minas Gerais (UFMG), Brazil. He holds a Master's degree (2006) and a Doctorate (2012) in Law from UFMG, receiving the CAPES Thesis Award for best Law thesis in Brazil in 2013. Meyer served as Dean of the Graduate Program in Law at UFMG from 2021 to 2023. He was a Visiting Researcher at King's College Brazil Institute (2014-2015). He was the Executive Secretariat Coordinator of the Latin American Network for Transitional Justice (2016-2017) and a Resident Researcher at the Institute for Advanced Transdisciplinary Studies at UFMG (2018-2019). He is currently a Researcher at the Brazilian National Council of Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq). Additionally, he coordinates Constituições - Center for Constitutionalism and Comparativism and serves as the Executive Secretary of Emilio Peluso Neder Meyer the Brazilian Section of ICON-S (2022-2025).

Sergio Verdugo is the Co-President of the International Society of Public Law, after previously serving as its Secretary General. He is a professor of law at IE University and an editor of the International Journal of Constitutional Law (ICON). His work has appeared in journals such as the Columbia Journal of Transnational Law, Global Constitutionalism, the University of Miami Law Review, the International Journal of Constitutional Law, Revista de Derecho del Estado, Revista Chilena de Derecho, and the Hague Journal on the Rule of Law. He holds degrees from New York University, University of California, Berkeley, P. Universidad Católica de Chile, and Universidad del Desarrollo.

Juliano Zaiden Benvindo is a Tenured Full-Time Associate Professor of Comparative Constitutional Law at the University of Brasília (UnB), Brazil, where he has taught since November 2009, following the completion of his Ph.D. summa cum laude at Humboldt University of Berlin, Germany, as a DAAD fellow. He is the Director of the Center for Comparative Constitutional Studies at UnB (CECC/UnB). From 2014 to 2016, he was the Dean of the UnB Graduate Program in Law (Master and Ph.D.). Since 2016, he has been a Research Fellow of the Brazilian National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq). In 2013–2014, he was a DAAD-CAPES Postdoctoral Visiting Fellow at the Centre for European Law and Politics at the University of Bremen, Germany. In 2019 and 2022, he was a Humboldt-CAPES Senior Visiting Fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law in Heidelberg, Germany. He is a founding member of the Brazilian Chapter of ICON-S and currently serves as its Co-Chair alongside Juliana Cesário Alvim.

Rozana Reigota Naves Rector, UnB

Professor, mother, woman, and researcher, Rozana Reigota Naves is from Brasília and has built a solid life path through education. She was a professor at the Catholic University of Brasília from 1997 to 2006, when she joined the University of Brasília (UnB) as a faculty member in the then Department of Linguistics, Classical and Vernacular Languages.

She has a deep personal and professional connection with UnB, where she earned her Master's degree (1998) and Ph.D. in Linguistics (2005). Her research and academic advising are grounded in the theoretical framework of Generative Grammar, developed by Noam Chomsky.

In addition to an extensive body of academic and technical/technological work, she manages international cooperation agreements, has coordinated the Grammar Theory group within the National Association of Graduate Studies and Research in Linguistics, and served as a member of the National Conference on Indigenous School Education under the Ministry of Education.

Before being elected Rector, she served as Director of the Institute of Languages and as Dean of Administration, where she became known for her democratic, transparent, and attentive leadership. Her approach is marked by active listening, technical expertise, and effective actions focused on creative and systemic problem-solving—fully aligned with the original vision of UnB as conceived by Darcy Ribeiro and Anísio Teixeira.

Erin Delaney Chair

Erin F. Delaney is the Inaugural Director of the Global Centre for Democratic Constitutionalism and the Leverhulme Professor of Comparative Constitutional Law at University College London, Faculty of Laws. She is also Professor of Law at Northwestern University (USA), currently on leave. Her scholarship explores constitutionalism in comparative perspective, with a focus on federalism and judicial design. She was named the 2022 Federal Scholar in Residence at Eurac Research's Institute for Comparative Federalism in Bolzano, Italy, and held the Fulbright Visiting Research Chair in the Theory and Practice of Constitutionalism and Federalism at McGill University. She has also held research fellowships at the University of Edinburgh and the Université Libre de Bruxelles. She received her J.D., magna cum laude, from NYU School of Law; a Ph.D. from the University of Cambridge; and an A.B. in Government, magna cum laude, from Harvard College. She currently serves as Secretary General of the International Society of Public Law (ICON-S).

Justice Luís Roberto Barroso is the Chief Justice of the Brazilian Federal Supreme Court. He previously served as President of the Superior Electoral Court. A Full Professor of Constitutional Law at the State University of Rio de Janeiro (UERJ), he holds a Master of Laws from Yale University (USA) and a Doctorate and Habilitation from UERJ. In 2018, he was a Senior Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School. Justice Barroso is also a renowned legal scholar and author of several works, including Curso de Direito Constitucional Contemporâneo (Contemporary Constitutional Law Course).

Professor Jeanette Hofmann has a background in political science. She serves as a professor of Internet Politics at the Institute for Media and Communication Studies of the Freie Universität Berlin since 2017. At the Berlin Social Science Center (WZB), she heads the research group "Politics of Digitalisation". She is a founding co-director of the Alexander von Humboldt Institute for Internet and Society (HIIG) since 2012, and principal investigator at the Weizenbaum Institute for the Networked Society since 2017. From 2007 to 2010 she worked as a researcher at the London School of Economics in the Research Centre on Risk and Regulation. Jeanette Hofmann's current research addresses the interplay of democracy and digitalisation. This concerns, for example, the connection between disinformation and democratic backsliding, the European regulation of digital platforms and Al, with a focus on the risk-based approach.

Silvia Suteu Speaker

Prof. Silvia Suteu is Chair in Law at the European University Institute. Her research lies at the intersection of comparative constitutional law, constitutional theory, and gender and law, with a focus on deliberative constitutional change, democratic theory, and gender-sensitive constitution-making. Her book Eternity Clauses in Democratic Constitutionalism (OUP, 2021) won the ICON-S Best Book Prize in 2023. She co-authored ABC for a Gender-sensitive Constitution and ABC for Gender-sensitive Legislation, widely used in legal education and activism, especially in the MENA region. She leads the Feminist Judgments in Central and Eastern Europe Project and co-leads the UK team on the ORA-funded project on unwritten constitutional norms. She is also a collaborator on a Canadian-Brazilian project on feminist constitutionalism. Prior to joining the EUI, she was Associate Professor at UCL and has held visiting positions in Zurich and Rome. She serves on editorial and executive boards and advises on constitutional reform globally. She is the Co-Chair of the Central and Eastern European Chapter of ICON-S.

Tarun Khaitan is the Professor (Chair) of Public Law at the LSE Law School and an Honorary Professorial Fellow at Melbourne Law School. Previously, he has been the Head of Research at the Bonavero Institute of Human Rights (Oxford), the Professor of Public Law and Legal Theory (Oxford), Vice Dean (Faculty of Law, Oxford), and a Visiting Professor of Law (Chicago, Harvard, and NYU law schools). He completed his undergraduate studies (BA LLB Hons) at the National Law School (Bangalore) in 2004 as the 'Best All-Round Graduating Student'. He then came to Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar and completed his postgraduate studies at Exeter College. His research has been cited in over a dozen cases by influential courts, including the Indian Supreme Court, the Canadian Supreme Court, the European Court of Human Rights, the Israeli Supreme Court, the Pakistani Supreme Court, the Madras High Court, the High Court of Kerala, the Superior Court of Quebec, the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia, and in the Opinion of the Advocate General before the European Court of Justice (a list of these cases is available here). His research has also been cited in the Indian Parliament.

Juliana Cesario Alvim Chair

Juliana Cesario Alvim is an Assistant Professor at Central European University (CEU) in Austria and at Rio de Janeiro State University Law School (UERJ), in Brazil. She has also been a Human Rights Law Professor at the Federal University of Minas Gerais (UFMG), where she coordinated the Human Rights Clinic. Her research focuses on constitutionalism in Latin America, gender and sexuality, courts and mobilization, equality and difference, and strategic human rights litigation. She is co-chair of the Brazilian Chapter of the International Society of Public Law (ICON·S), a member of several research networks on gender, constitutionalism, and democracy, and co-host of the weekly podcast Sem Precedentes on Brazil's Supreme Court and Constitution, recipient of the Brazilian Judiciary's 2024 National Journalism Award. With over a decade of experience in human rights strategic litigation, she has acted before Brazilian, regional, and UN human rights bodies and courts.

Chief Justice of the National High Court of Brazil (STJ). Chair of the Global Judicial Institute on the Environment (GJIE). Chair Emeritus of the World Commission on Environmental Law (WCEL). Appointed Justice of the National High Court in 2006 by President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, Professor Antonio Herman Benjamin was a career Public Prosecutor of the State of São Paulo (MPSP) for over twenty years.

César Rodríguez-Garavito is Professor of Law and Chair of the Center for Human Rights and Global Justice at NYU School of Law. He is the founding director of the Earth Rights Research & Action (TERRA) Clinic, the Climate Law Accelerator and the More-Than-Human Life (MOTH) Program. Professor Rodríguez-Garavito is an Earth rights and human rights scholar and a field lawyer whose work focuses on international environmental law, Indigenous peoples' rights and more-than-human rights. She writes widely on environmental law and administrative law in national regimes and has won awards for her teaching and research. 




